Recommendation

Authorize the General Manager to execute Amendment No. 2 to Agreement 09-01, and Amendment No. 1 to Agreement 09-04.

Background

Agreement 09-01 between the District and Questa Engineering is for the preparation of a feasibility study for the proposed Camp Berryessa. The administrative draft study is complete, but additional time is needed for the District and the Bureau of Reclamation to review the study for accuracy and completeness.

Agreement 09-04 between the District and Questa Engineering is for the preparation of the design of the crossing of the SMART railroad immediately north of Green Island Road, to accommodate the proposed Napa River and Bay Trail. The draft design of the crossing is complete, but submittal of the design and application to the State Public Utilities Commission was delayed to give the California Department of Fish and Game, which owns the property north of the railroad crossing, an opportunity to review the design.

Both agreements are proposed to be extended until the end of the fiscal year--June 30, 2010. This should provide more than ample time to complete the work.

Recommendation

Direct staff to notify California State Parks, the City of Calistoga, County of Napa and other interested parties that the District is considering amending its policy on dogs on the Oat Hill Mine Trail to require dogs to be on-leash, consistent with State Parks policy for Robert Louis Stevenson State Park, and schedule this issue for Board consideration at the regular February meeting of the Board.

Background

Prior to the formal opening of the Oat Hill Mine Trail to public non-motorized recreational use, the Board approved various policies for the trail. The policies adopted by the Board at that time simply reflected existing use patterns as much as possible, recognizing that they would likely need to be reconsidered in the future as the District gained experience with managing the trail.

The policy on dogs that was adopted at that time stated that dogs were allowed on the trail. Signs were installed in the kiosks at each trailhead stating that dogs were required to be on-leash or off-leash if under strict voice control.

Most public usage of the Oat Hill Mine Trail occurs in the first four to five miles of the trail heading north from Calistoga. Approximately half of this length of trail crosses Robert Louis Stevenson State Park, with the remainder crossing either private land or State School Lands administered by the State Lands Commission. Outside of the trail corridor within the State Park, dogs must be on leash at all times. Neither dogs nor people are permitted to leave the trail corridor where it crosses private land. State School Lands have no posted or enforced rules whatsoever guiding public use.

Since the Oat Hill Mine Trail passes through Robert Louis Stevenson State Park, the State Parks ranger stationed at Bothe-Napa State Park often receives public complaints that are related to the Oat Hill Mine Trail. Recent discussions with this ranger indicates their office periodically receives complaints about dogs off-leash bothering wildlife, other trail users, and other dogs which are on leash. District staff recently received a fairly serious complaint from a trail user whose dog, which was on-leash, was attacked on two separate occassions in the past two months by other, off-leash dogs. In one of those incidents, the dog which was attacked had to be taken to the veterinarian for treatment of its wounds.

One difficulty with the current policy is that having the policy for the trail different from the policy in the State Park creates a fair amount of confusion. A second problem is that "voice control" means different things to different people, leading to conflicts between trail users when one person's actions do not match another person's expectations. Finally, when exposed to temptations like fleeing wildlife, or other dogs, very few dogs are truly under voice control.

For these reasons, it probably makes sense to modify the District's policy to be consistent with that for Robert Louis Stevenson State Park. While the District does not currently have a mechanism in place to issue citations and impose fines for violations, having a clear policy consistent with that for the State Park would make it easier to explain to the public what the expected norm is, and reduce those conflicts between users that arise simply because of ambiguity and lack of understanding.

Prior to modifying the policy, however, it is important that the District consult with its potentiallyaffected partners and others interested in the trail. This would include, at a minimum, the County of Napa, California State Parks, and the City of Calistoga. Regular trail users should also be notified through posting at the trailhead. This consultation is critical to gaining buy-in from District partners and trail users. In order to give time for the District to gather and analyze partner and public input, staff recommends that the Board schedule further consideration of this issue for its regular February meeting.

Although education, encouragement and voluntary compliance is always preferable to a regulatory approach, longer term, and as called for in Project D.8 of the District Master Plan, the District will need to set up the mechanisms necessary for the District to adopt and implement legally-enforceable regulations for use of District facilities. This will require a fair amount of effort and expense, however. Rather than do nothing until such mechanisms are in place, staff believes it makes sense to take steps now to adopt standards which are as clear as possible, thereby improving the liklihood for voluntary compliance and amicable resolution of disputes between trail users.

District staff and our partners are continuing to research issues related to the property, including potential public access locations, potential trail alignments, and easements and other encumbrances which affect the property. The State Coastal Conservancy has indicated an interest in assisting with the funding necessary to purchase the property. We are now waiting for the City to complete title research for the property so that an appraisal can be prepared. The surplusing process has slowed down due to new discussions between the City and residents of Green Valley over overall water supply arrangements.
Vine Trail	A Class I bicycle/pedestrian path extending from Calistoga to the Vallejo Ferry Terminal	The District has entered into an MOU with the Vine Trail Coalition to provide assistance as requested by the Coalition in receiving funds, preparing plans and environmental documents, constructing and operating the trail. The District on May 1st submitted a request to Congressman Thompson to include the Vine Trail as an authorized project within the next federal surface transportation program. A similar request was submitted to Senators Feinstein and Boxer in July 2009. <u>The District, the Bay Area Ridge Trail, the San Francisco Bay Trail and the Vine Trail Coalition are working together to promote common sections of these trails.</u>
Wild Lake Ranch	Possible joint management of trails, camping and picnic areas through agreement between the Land Trust, the District and State Parks	The District is participating in the development of a strategic plan for the property, together with other public lands in the area, that is being led by the Land Trust of Napa County. The advisory committee has met once, and completed a field trip to inspect the property. The planning process was put on hold due to the freeze in the state bond-funded grant; however, the freeze was mostly lifted in August and the planning process is restarting.

Completed Projects

Berryessa Vista Acquisition

Purchase of 224 acres from the Land Trust of Napa County for use as a public park completed in early 2008 using State Prop 12 funds.

Connolly Ranch

Construction of patio, restrooms and cooking facilities completed in 2008 using State Prop 12 funds.

Linda Falls

Conservation easement accepted in spring 2008 from Land Trust of Napa County to provide additional protection for this 39 acre property, which is owned by the land trust

Master Plan Development

The Master Plan for 2008-2013 was approved in January 2009

Moore Creek Open Space Park

Acquisition of 673 acres in the Moore Creek Watershed completed in December 2008. Trail reroute to remove two stream crossings mostly completed in May 2009. New heater installed in gatehouse in

Napa River Ecological Reserve

Parking area paved, and rock barrier installed to control vehicular access in 2007. Trash enclosure constructed and entry signs restored by volunteers in 2008. Deteriorated kiosk removed in 2008. The District in July 2008 assumed the County's role in managing the preserve under the joint management agreement with DFG. A new maintenance contract with the non-profit organization Options 3 was started in January 2009. The old deteriorated information kiosk, which had become a serious eyesore, was removed in November 2008.

Napa River Flood Control Easement

Conservation easement accepted by District in 2007 to facilitate Flood District project and grant funding

Newell Preserve Improvements As part of the arrangement with the land trust on the District's purchase of Berryessa Vista, the land trust was willing to use some of the proceeds Provide on-site water supply for group campground and so from the transaction to fund a well pump and distribution system at the Preserve. However, the first well drilled by the City of American Canyon cattle can be restricted from access to riparian areas.

River to Ridge Trail Enhancements

Installation of animal silouettes along the entryway fence illustrating the types of birds and mammals that can be found in the area completed by Eagle Scout candidate in 2008. In November 2008 five Valley Oak trees were planted at the Highway 221 entrance to the trail with the assistance of a volunteer from CNPS.

Skyline Park Improvements Phase I

Erosion control work on Lake Marie Road, and paving of campground loop road, completed in 2007 using State Prop 12 funds.
