Attached is the pre-audited financial report for the year ending 3/31/12.

Page 1 of the report is the Balance Sheet, which outlines the District's Assets, Liabilities and Fund Balance.

- The cash balance as of June 30, 2012 was \$345,307
- The District has receivables of \$271,101 which consists of the following:

State – Natural Resources Grant \$246,564 State – Coastal Conservancy Grant \$24,537

- The District owns capital assets, valued at \$7,219,188 (net depreciation) consisting of mostly land.
- Fund balance, not including investments in capital assets, is broken out by the following:

Moore Creek (remaining County grant from FY 10-11) \$166,133 Camp Berryessa (Mead Foundation from FY 10-11) \$50,000 State Parks (donations) \$162,499 Available fund balance for Parks operations \$138,419

Page 2 of the report is the summary revenue and expense statement for the fiscal year, showing amounts for both budget and actuals, resulting in a net surplus of \$87,757.

Pages 3 - 12 provide a breakdown of revenues and expenses by each District Division.

TelePacific Communications for phone and internet service at Bothe-Napa Valley

State Park with a total value of approximately \$13,158

Recommendation

Authorize General Manager to enter into three year agreement with TelePacific Communications to provide telephone and internet service to Bothe-Napa Valley State Park

Background

When the District took over management of Bothe-Napa Valley State Park on April 1, 2012, it inherited the Department of Parks and Recreation's agreement for phone service provided by ATT and internet service provided by Comcast.

The current internet service is very unreliable and slow, because it relies on a wireless connection between one of the houses fronting Highway 29 and the Visitor Center. In the summer, the internet connection is regularly down on hot afternoons. The phone service is likewise unreliable, with considerable static on the line in the winter when the wires get wet. In addition, long-distance calls incur extra charges; as a result, standard practice at the park has been to minimize long-distance calls, which limits the ability of staff to fully serve members of the public wishing to get information about the park.

Staff recommends replacing these services with a package service provided by TelePacific Communications. The overall cost should be roughly equivalent to the combined cost of ATT and Comcast service, and includes 2,000 minutes of free long-distance service each month (more than enough to cover our usage). Most importantly, it should not suffer from the interruptions and slow speed of the current service; as part of the package, the communication wires to the park will be upgraded to accommodate T-1 service. Another reason to consider a new service is existing wireless communication equipment is located in the Wright house fronting on Highway 29. The District is in the process of repairing this house and expects to have it ready to rent out in a few months time, but before it can be rented the communications equipment will need to be removed. Switching to TelePacific will eliminate the need to incur several thousand dollars in expenses to relocate this equipment. The downside of the proposed package service is that it requires a three-year contract, with hefty penalties for early termination.

This proposal has been developed in consultation with the County's communications expert as well as a communications consultant who has volunteered his time to help the District.

Recommendation

Receive the report, and give direction to staff on the desired content and format of future reports.

Background

Section III.A.(7) of the District By-laws authorizes the General Manager to bind the district for supplies, materials, labor, and other valuable consideration, in accordance with board policy and the adopted District budget, up to \$10,000 for non-construction purposes and up to \$25,000 for construction purposes, provided that all such expenditures are subsequently reported to the Board of Directors. Section III.A.(8) of the By-laws authorizes the General Manager to apply for grants and receive donations, subject to reporting such actions to the Board of Directors.

In the past, each month staff prepared a special accounting of those expenditures which required reporting to the Board. As District finances have gotten more complex, the time involved in preparing this special report has increased substantially, and with this the potential for errors in reporting has also increased.

Staff therefore is proposing an alternate reporting format, which is used for this month's report. Attached is the General Ledger for each department, showing all expenditures by department and account. It uses a lot more paper, and is a little more difficult to review in that it includes expenses that were previously approved through specific contracts, as well as recurring expenses that have been exempted by the Board from monthly reporting. However, the report can be generated automatically, saving staff time and reducing the potential for inadvertent omissions. The Board may also find it useful to see the additional detail in order to have a full understanding of where financial resources are allocated.

The top section of the report lists the Department: these include Parks Administration (what we have called the General Fund), and each of the eight parks and trails we are involved with. Within each Department, expenses are categorized by Account (eg, professional services, office supplies, etc).

In addition to the expenditures noted in the General Ledger, the General Manager has also taken the following actions which require reporting to the Board:

- The General Manager on August 28, 2012 signed an engagement letter with the Napa County Auditor-Controller's Office to perform an audit of cash handling procedures at Bothe-Napa Valley State Park, for an amount not to exceed \$1,500.
- The General Manager approved a contract with Brent Harris Engineering for \$9,375 to construct just under one mile of the Valentine-Vista Trail (southern segment)

Bay Area Ridge Trail Realignment

Amendment to the proposed alignment of the Bay Area Ridge Trail extend north to the Oat Hill Mine

Ridge Trail Board has approved evaluating the amended alignment. District staff is working with the Ridge Trail and other partners to prepare the evaluation. Sonoma County agency staff have prepared an initial analysis of trail alignments on the Sonoma side of the Napa-Sonoma border. A proposed realignment for the Napa portion of the route has been prepared, has been reviewed by the Ridge Trail staff, and is now undergoing minor changes in response to those comments. Approval of the new alignment is scheduled for consideration by the Ridge Trail Board later this month.

Bay Area Ridge Trail Tuteur Loop

Assignment of Tuteur Loop Ridge Trail easement from the Bay Area Ridge Trail to the District

The Bay Area Ridge Trail Council obtained a donated easement from the Tuteur family and constructed a section of Bay Area Ridge Trail adjacent to Skyline Park. The Council wishes to transfer this easement to the District. Staff for the District and Council have gathered all the relevant documents, and initiated discussion with the Tuteur family to determine if there are any issues or amendments that should be considered. Next steps are to complete legal review of the documents, make amendments if warranted, obtain the consent of the Coastal Conservancy (who funded the trail construction), and then execute the assignment. Completing transfer of the easement has been temporarily put on hold until staff workload eases.

Bay/River Trail -- American Canyon to Napa

An 8+ mile recreational trail between the cities of American Canyon and Napa generally following the Napa River and interior levees of associated wetlands.

Phase Two--Green Island Road to Soscol Ferry Questa has completed a revised the draft PUC permit application for a public crossing of the SMART, NRCA and the PUC have verbally agreed to allow Road the railroad crossing; formal concurrence is now being sought. District staff is continuing to work with SMART to get their formal approval. LSA Associates has completed a biological survey for the Fagan Marsh area; based on the results, DFG has indicated they do not want the trail alignment to follow the levee on the north side of Fagan Marsh; District staff is now reviewing the feasibility of an alternative alignment. DFG, the Bay Trail Project and the Coastal Conservancy are funding the prepation of the supplemental environmental analysis for the section of the trail next to DFG's ponds 9 and 10; this work is being handled by Ducks Unlimited on behalf of DFG. District staff met with the involved parties on May 25, 2011 and again on November 9, 2011 to resolve questions, and is continuing to meet to address questions about the scope of additional CEQA review. DU has comleted their draft review, including cost estimates. District staff together with Napa Sanitation District staff toured two other water treatment facilities that have segments of the Bay Trail going through or past their facilities. Staff is waiting for DFG and DU to complete the supplemental environmental analysis for the trail adjacent to Ponds 9 and 10...

Phase Three--Soscol Ferry Road to Napa Pipe All permits and permissions have been obtained, and construction bid documents are done. Caltrans has determined the project is eligible for federal Transportation Enhancements grant funds, and has approved NEPA review for the project Staff is now completing Caltrans' extensive paperwork needed to obtain the funds. The goal was to to construct the project May-June 2012, but Caltrans approval was not be ready in time, so the funding commitment has lapsed.

Berrvessa Estates

Acquire 480 acres next to Berryessa Estates from BLM at no fee through their Recreation and Public Purpose Act procedure. Would serve as a wilderness park for local residents eventually be the northern trailhead for a trail between Berryess Estates and Pope Canyon.

The District in 2009 applied to BLM for a no-fee transfer of thsi property to the District for the no-fee transfer of this property; while this transfer has received conceptual approval by BLM staff, the formal approal has dragged; several meetings have been held over the past three years to try and speed to process, but BLM staff has so far had higher priorities. CDF and the Pope Valley Volunteer Fire Department have added a proposal to construct a fire substation on a corner of the property. A community meeting was held March 2009 to get input from the community. The District has completed the donation to the District of a small, 0.2 acre property that provides critical access to the northeast corner of the property. The District has allowed excess soil from a nearby public project to be disposed of on this property, which saves them money and facilitates the eventual construction of the fire substation; staff is working on a drainage easement to the County to assure the County takes care of the extension of the storm drain under this new fill. CDF crews did extensive fire break work in 2009 through 2011 to protect the residences next to the BLM land.

Berryessa Vista

Planning and stewardship of this 224 acre wilderness park.

Volunteers working with the District have completed detailed GIS mapping showing all existing roads, creek crossings, vista points and potential campsites. Continuing damage by off-road vehicles trespassing on the property was noted. The District sent a letter was sent to all property owners in that area introducing the District, explaining the deed restriction prohibiting off road vehicles, and asking for their cooperation. Since then there has been less observed damage, although the problem is not resolved. No further work is anticipated until Lake Berryessa Trail planning is completed, as that is a key step in gaining overland access to the property. District staff has been meeting with Reclamation, their consultants and interested parties on the trail planning and prioritization.

Blue Ridge/Berryess Peak Trail

Obtain right of way and construct trail to provide public access to extensive federal lands on Blue Ridge and to Berryessa Peak

Obtained donated trail easement from the Ahmann family to close gaps between existing public lands on Blue Ridge. A Negative Declaration and Use Permit hearing was approved December 16, 2009 by the County Planning Commission. An Operations and Management Plan has been approved by the property owner and the District. There have been volunteer trail building work parties have been held numerous times between 2011 and the present. BLM staff on April 11th inspected the proposed trail alignment where it crosses BLM land. District and BLM staff met on August 5, 2011 to discuss BLM review of this project. BLM's biologist inspected the alignment on September 17, 2011. District staff met with Fish and Game on June 15, 2012 to discuss signage at the trailhead on DFG property, and is now preparing proposed signage language for DFG review.

Camp Berryessa

Redevelopment of former Boy Scout Camp into a group/environmental education camp.

CEQA and NEPA review is complete, as is the Use Agreement between the District and Reclamation, A grant for \$50,000 to help with construction has been provided by the Mead Foundation, together with a \$1.5 million grant from the State Coastal Conservancy. The contract for preparation of plans and specifications with Psomas was approved by the Board at its October meeting, and Psomas has now completed the 60% drawings, which next will go to Reclamation for their review. A meeting of potential future users was held September 22, 2011. The District has contracted for labor compliance monitoring for the construction work. Efforts to reuse the existing well proved unsucessful, though water quality tests did demonstrate the groundwater in the area is of acceptable quality. Reclamation has approved drilling a new well to replace the existing non-functioning well, a well drillier has been selected, and he foresees completing the work in September. The camp will likely open in the fall of

District Non-profit Foundation

Organize a non-profit foundation to raise funds for District projects

The District Board has approved the goals, objectives and basic structure for a non-profit foundation to assist the District with fundraising. Formation of the foundation will likely be timed to the opening of Camp Berryessa.

Lake Hennessev North Shore Trails

Would open up several miles of existing dirt access road, and construct approximately 1 mile of new single track trail, into a loop trail system on the north side of Lake Hennessey, and connecting to the planned Moore Creek Open Space Park trail system

In November, 2009 the Napa City Council directed city staff to work with the District to finalize an agreement for the proposed Hennessey trails. A plant survey of the new section of trail was completed on April 3, 2010. The District approved a Mitigated Negative Declaration on February 14, 2011. A final lease agreement and operations plan has been completed and was approved by the District Board in August 2012. City Council action is expected on September 18th, Trail work is expected to begin in the Spring/Summer of 2013 and public trail access is slated to be available come Fall of 2013.

Moore Creek Open Space Park Development

Development of open space park on 673 acres acquired by the District adacent to City of Napa watershed lands at Lake Hennessey to protect habitat, provide recreational trails, and overnight camping facilities.

All discretionary permits have been obtained, and park improvements are underway. The County road department completed paving of the entryway driveway in November 2012. The design of the new septic system for the ranch house has been approved by the Regional Water Quality Control Board and the County. The eastern boundary survey is complete except for a small amount of flagging; a partial payment to the surveyor has been worked out, since he cannot finish flagging until brush clearance work is completed. Monthly volunteer work parties have performed numerous tasks on the property, including trail repair and construction, fence building, restoration planting, and removal of invasive french broom. In 2012, the ranch house was used by VOCAL for a crew leader training in March, and a Land Trust first aide training in February. Grading permits have been obtained for construction of the South Segment of the Valentine Trail and for improving the staging area. A building permit application for the trailhead restroom has been submitted. A contract for construction of the southern section of the Valentaine-Vista trail was awarded in August, and the work is underway. The park is expected to open to the public in the fall of 2012.

Napa River Ecological Reserve Restoration

Remove invasive plants and restore native vegetaion in the entryway meadow, replace damaged signage and information panels, and if feasible install a seasonal bridge

The CCC did mechanical and chemical weed removal and installed an all-weather surface on the trail from the parking area to the river levee, in May and June 2010. Additional invasive weed removal, mapping, and cleanup was done by volunteers on numerous occassions in 2010, 2011 and 2012. The District has used grant funding to bring several thousand students to the site to study ecology of the area and assist with the habitat restoration. Staff met with invasive plant control specialists in June 2011 to evaluate eradification efforts to date and plan next steps. Native plant cuttings gathered from the reserve were propagated and planted by volunteers in Dec 2011 and Jan 2012. Supplemental grant funding for the restortion work was awarded by the County Wildlife Commission in 2011. Both the Coastal Conservancy grant and the Wildlife Commission grant the District received to pay for restoration work have had their deadlines extended until March and June of 2013. This time extension will allow us to continue invasive weed removal. DFG in 2011 agreed to a simplified approval process for field trips. District staff met with DFG on December 8, 2011 to agree on work plans for 2012. Several school field trips have been held since the beginning of the calendar year, and a private contractor was hired in spring 2012 to perform additional invasive plant removal.

Oat Hill Mine Trail

The litigation holding up this project has been successfully concluded, meaning the District can now complete repairs to the first 1/2 mile of the trail. Because of the cash Improvements to first 1/2 mile of trail next to Calistoga flow needs of the Napa River and Bay Trail project, completion of the work on the Oat Hill Mine will be delayed until summer of 2012. Several of the trail sign posts have been vandalized and will need to be replaced. The District is continueing to work with Tuleyome on a project to clean up the Twin Peaks and Corona Mines, in the hopes this may enable the District to safely open the northern Oat Hill Mine Trail for public use. District staff has installed new signage disuading hikers from trespassing on neighboring properties as well as signs indicating that the Trail is temporally closed during hunting season.

Oat Hill Mine Trail

Transfer of 40 acre parcel from BLM

The District in 2008 applied to BLM for a non-fee transfer to the District of a 40 acre parcel at Maple Springs on the Oat Hill Mine Trail; this application is pending. Staff met with BLM in February 2011 to discuss how to speed up this transfer; another meeting with the same topic was held August 5, 2011. The District is still waiting on BLM to process the application.

Rector Ridge/Stags Leap Ridge Trail

Construction of staging area and 6+ miles of Ridge Trail climbing east from Silverado Trail near Rector Creek.

CEQA on this project was completed several years ago--staff has prepared a draft update to the Negative Declation due to the passage of time since the original approval. The project concept has been approved by the District Board, and was positively viewed by the Veterans Home administration. However, Veterans Home staff had been having difficulty figuring out what approval process is needed, because of ongoing discussions at the state level about the appropriate roles and future programs for the Veterans Home, and then key management staff at the Veterans Home retired in November 2010, so progress was delayed pending the filling of their vacant positions. The District will restart the process when other project priorities are under control.

River to Ridge Trail

constructed (it curently encroaches on private property in two locations)

Deeds accomplishing the adjustment in property boundaries between Syar and the State have been recorded. If the County ends up not being able to purchase Skyline Lot line adjustment to legalize River to Ridge Trail as Park, including the area with the River to Ridge Trail, then the County and the state will need to record a new trail alignment easement description.

Skyline Park Protection

Purchase of Skyline Park from the State

Three past legislative efforts to authorize sale to the County failed due to unrelated disagreements between the state legislature and administration. Separately, the County in September 2009 approved a new park overlay zone and an updated Master Plan for Skyline Park. A fourth legislative effort by Assemblymember Evans in 2010, sponsored by Napa County and supported by the District, was approved by the legislature and signed by the Governor. The County and state General Services have agreed on an appraisal process for determining the fair market value purchase price. The County has retained an appraiser acceptable to the State, and a draft appraisal is now being reviewed by the County and the State. In late April 2012 the state indicated they were rescinding their offer to sell the park even at the unencumbered estimated value, and were going to prepare their own appraisal. Acquisition efforts are on hold until the State completes its revised appraisal.

Spanish Valley, Crystal Flats, and Stone Corral

Planning for 3,400 acres of open space donated by Bob and Evalyn Trinchero

Staff met with key community leaders from Lake Berryessa Estates on February 6 and March 6, 2011. A public session was held April 21st at the Pope Valley Farm Center. The District has negotiated an easement across the District's Stone Corral property to resolve one of the clouds on the title to this land; this easement was approval by the Board at its October meeting, and has now been finalized and recorded. Staff met with the LBEPOA Board on November 13th and again on December 4, 2011 to discuss use of the Crystal Flats and Stone Corral areas. District staff has prepared a draft agreement betweent he District and the Association, which the Association is now reviewing. A formal Association response is expected in mid-September, following a series of community meanings which they are holding to canvas their membership. The District took full possession of the properties on January 1, 2012. The District is working with a well driller to make the existing well in Spanish Valley functional. The District has contracted for botantical and bird surveys over the course of this year. The Association elected a new Board of Directors in May 2012. Staff completed a preliminary survey of the Spanish Valley access road in late July and, while legal access to the property has been established, it does not appear that the existing road is located within the Spanish Valley Trail easement. This will require discussions with the adjacent property owner, which may push our timeline on to opening Spanish Valley for public use.

State Parks

Grist Mill State Historic Park

Operate Bothe-Napa Valley State Park and the Bale The District, with assistance from the Napa Valley State Parks Association took over management of the parks on April 1, 2012. The Park Manager and Assistant Manager have been hired, a part-time community outreach professional is under contract, and seasonal park aides have been hired. Camp hosts are in place. A County permit for the pool was obtained in July and the pool was reopened immediately thereafter. The state is nearly complete with installing 3 yurts, and the District begun site prep in anticipation of installing an additional 7 yurts. Final inspections and occupancy permits for the State yurts are expected in September once fire-safety clearing has been completed. State Fire Marshall permit approval is still being sought for the other 7 yurts. Numerous volunteer projects were held in April (PG&E event improving the Mill, firewood splitting, hazardous tree removal, mowing, pool cleaning, native plant garden maintenance, historic orchard restoration, and lots of trash removal. A volunteer forestly management group has been formed and the District has acquired a boom truck and other equipment in support of their mission. Utility service accounts have been transferred from the state to the District. Work on an improved recycling system is nearly complete. Septic tanks serving the cabins and picnic aread had to be pumped in May, and sewer lines were located and cleared of root blockages. Two broken gas lines were fixed. Nearly \$270,000 in gifts, grants and pledges have been obtained to assist with improvements at the parks.

Vallejo Lakes

Possible purchase of 1100 acres of surplus Vallejo Water District lands, of which 200 acres are located in Napa County

Discussions between the District, the Land Trust of Napa County, the County of Solano and the Solano Land Trust indicate a common desire to work together to purchase this property adjacent to Skyline Park. The City Council of the City of Vallejo has officially authorized staff to pursue surplusing of the property. The City of Vallejo has hired an appraiser to prepare an estimate of the property's fair market value, but this has not yet been released. District staff met with Solano Land Trust staff on September 7, 2011 to discuss project status and next steps. The District GM, together with the County of Solano EO, in February 2012 each sent letters to the City of Vallejo expressing interest in the property and requesting notification per state law of any planned surplussing of the property. The District's analysis of County ROW's with potential for recreational trails identified a potential ROW through the Vallejo Lakes property; however, it appears that one short section of the historic ROW is in Solano County and appears to not have been properly established.

Vine Trail

A Class I bicycle/pedestrian path extending from Calistoga to the Vallejo Ferry Terminal sponsored by the Vine Trail Coalition, of which the District is a participating member.

The District has entered into an MOU with the Vine Trail Coalition to provide assistance as requested by the Coalition in receiving funds, preparing plans and environmental documents, constructing and operating the trail. The District, the Bay Area Ridge Trail, the San Francisco Bay Trail and the Vine Trail Coalition have prepared a joint Case Statement for the combined trail network for fundraising purposes. The District on Febuary 5, 2010 submitted an appropriations request for FY 2011 to Senator Feinstein, and a similar request to Congressman Thompson on February 26, 2010 on behalf of the Vine Trail Coalition. Approximately \$235,000 in federal Transportation Enhancements fund was available to construct the section of the trail under the Butler Bridge, but the District was not able to process the paperwork through Caltrans in time to use these funds. A new source of funding will need to be obtained.

Completed Projects

Bay/River Trail -- American Canvon to Napa Phase I

Phase One--Euclyptus Drive to Green Island Road

Construction of approximately 5 miles of Class I bicycle and pedestrian path in the vicinity of American Canyon along the Napa River was completed in April 2012, in partnership with the City of American Canyon, Department of Fish and Game and Napa Valleio Waste Management Authority. A formal opening ceremony was held June 2 2012

Berryessa Vista Acquisition

Purchase of 224 acres from the Land Trust of Napa County for use as a public park completed in early 2008 using State Prop 12 funds.

Connolly Ranch

Construction of patio, restrooms and cooking facilities completed in 2008 using State Prop 12 funds.

Oat Hill Mine Trail

The Oat Hill Mine Trail was formally opened in May 0f 2008, after a major volunteer work party doing signage installation, brush removal and erosion control.

Historic ROW Analysis

Staff has completed a comprehensive review of historic rights-of-way, and is now focusing attention on those which have greatest potential

Conservation easement accepted in spring 2008 from Land Trust of Napa County to provide additional protection for this 39 acre property, which is owned by the land trust

Master Plan Development

The Master Plan for 2008-2013 was approved in January 2009

Master Plan Update

First scheduled update to the Master Plan adopted in January 2009

Board adhoc committee appointed. Methodology for doing update has been agreed upon. Project was delayed due to competing demands on staff time (primarily the effort to keep Napa's state parks from closing. A draft update has been prepared by staff working with the Board ad hoc committee for the Master Plan update, and released by the Board at the April 9, 2012 meeting for public comment. The plan update was adopted by the Board at its June 2012 meeting.

Milliken Reservoir Trails and Picnic Area Feasibility Study

Would construct approximately 3 miles of Bay Area Ridge Trail plus addional feeder and loop trails, along with a staging and picnic area

The feasibility study has been completed, and accepted by the Board of Directors. The Napa City Council in November, 2009 approved city staff recommendation to hold off on the Miliken Reservoir trails project until the Hennessey trail project is up and running.

Moore Creek Open Space Park

Acquisition of 673 acres in the Moore Creek Watershed completed in December 2008.

Napa River Ecological Reserve Improvements

Parking area paved, and rock barrier installed to control vehicular access in 2007. Trash enclosure constructed and entry signs restored by volunteers in 2008. Deteriorated kiosk removed in 2008. The District in July 2008 assumed the County's role in managing the preserve under the joint management agreement with DFG. A new maintenance contract with the non-profit organization Options 3 was started in January 2009. The old deteriorated information kiosk, which had become a serious eyesore, was removed in November 2008.

Napa River Flood Control Easement

Conservation easement accepted by District in 2007 to facilitate Flood District project and grant funding

Newell Preserve Improvements

Provide on-site water supply for group campground for cattle

As part of the arrangement with the land trust on the District's purchase of Berryessa Vista, the land trust was willing to use some of the proceeds from the transaction to fund a well pump and distribution system at the Preserve. However, the first well drilled by the City of American Canyon came up dry. The City has dropped plans for digging any more test wells.

River to Ridge Trail Enhancements

Installation of animal silouettes along the entryway fence illustrating the types of birds and mammals that can be found in the area completed by Eagle Scout candidate in 2008. In November 2008 five Valley Oak trees were planted at the Highway 221 entrance to the trail with the assistance of a volunteer from CNPS.

River to Ridge Trail Entrace Enhancements

A new information kiosk was installed at the entrance in December 2008 as part of a Boy Scout project. Several Live Oak seedlings were donated by CNPS and have been planted at the entrance to improve its appearance.
