A follow-up survey of *The Cove* property was conducted in spring of 2018 to look at post-fire response by the indigenous vegetation. A catastrophic fire occurred in October of 2017, burning through the 160 acre property. The *Nun's Fire*, originating near Glen Ellen in Sonoma County, burned 55,556 acres between Carneros Valley and Bennett Valley including nearly 20,000 acres in Napa County. The fire burned through forest, chaparral and wetlands at The Cove, scorching the trunks of trees into the crowns that stood 100 ft. or more in height and leaving charred stumps in the chaparral. The fire created dangerous conditions in the campground area and required the removal of much of the dead timber.

Botanical field surveys for fire-following species took place on March 31, May 29 and June 20 of 2018. These surveys provided an opportunity to reveal the species that have long been resting in the seed bank since the previous fire. It was happenstance that surveys were completed in 2017 to assess the maturing forest and chaparral complex. It had reached a point of development that excluded the growth of many non-woody species. In particular, the Douglas Fir forest was nearly devoid of a herbaceous understory on the steep east facing slopes above the campground.

The March 2018 survey showed very little activity in this habitat with observance of sparsely distributed seedlings. Rainfall came in intermittent concentrations during the winter of 2017-18. The slow appearance of a post-fire response could be attributable to this but more likely was attributable to the eastern exposure and the 2000 plus foot elevation. By May, there was a significant display of herbaceous growth and the resprouting of oaks, hazelnuts, redwoods, nutmegs and bays was well under way. Some species such as Eastwood Manzanita and Chinquapin had resprouted in the chaparral but other obligate seeders (species not capable of resprouting) and shrub seedlings were also in great evidence. The suite of obligate seeders included a number of fire following annuals, perennials and shrubs. These temporary colonizers will fill the void until the pre-fire dominant species again reduce light availablility and outcompete with these temporary opportunists for water and nutrients.

The attached vascular plant list indicates 32 additional species (noted in red) that were observed in 2018 and not in 2017. A few of these may have been previously overlooked but the majority are now active solely as a response to the fire. Some species have seeds that were stimulated to germinate by chemicals in the smoke while others were stimulated by a flash of heat from the fire. Only 4 of the 32 new species are non-natives.

Some of the more notable post-fire species include:

Amorpha californica ssp. napensis (Napa False Indigo) – a small number of mature shrubs were observed near the upper ridge before the fire. This rare species showed some late season recovery, producing seedlings that were found in locations well beyond the 2017 footprint.

Antirrhinum vexillocalyculatum ssp. vexillocalyculatum (Wiry Snapdragon) – A few plants of this species were observed in 2017 on steep talus slopes. An extensive stand of this species was observed in the burned Douglas Fir -California Bay transition to Knobcone Pine Forest.

Clematis lasiantha (Chaparral Virgin's Bower) – This species was not detected in 2017 but numerous vines emerged under burned Douglas Fir and California Bay on the upper slopes below the transition to

Knobcone Forest. This is the first instance of this woody vine being recorded as a post-fire opportunist in Napa County.

Collinsia tinctoria (Sticky Chinese Houses) – This species was not observed in 2017 but came up in sheets on the steep talus under burned Douglas Fir and California Bay. It did not come into bloom until June, late for this species that is infrequently found in Napa County.

Dendromecon rigida (Tree Poppy) — This is a fire following shrub that was observed in 2017 but exploded in numbers after the fire. It will be a prominent species for several years in burned Knobcone Pine Forest and Manzanita Chaparral.

Geranium carolinianum (Carolina Geranium) – This native Geranium was not seen before the fire. It occurred in low numbers in the outer perimeter of the campground area. This is a post-fire opportunist under burned Douglas Fir at The Cove.

Helianthemum scoparium (Common Rush Rose) – This species was not observed in 2017 and has proven to be a strong post-fire player in chaparral communities in 2018. This sub-shrub will persist for a few years, forming a compact ball of slender branches producing numerous small yellow flowers.

Lilium rubescens (Redwood Lily) – This perennial was observed in 2017 but all plants seen were vegetative and did not produce flowers. After a fire, this species blooms vigorously, availing itself of the abundant nutrients and light. At The Cove, it was seen in greater numbers and in locations not found before. Perhaps numbers will continue to increase until the forest recovers.

Phacelia nemoralis (Shade Phacelia) - This species was considered to be rare in Napa County before the 2017 fires. Since then, it has appeared in numerous locations in burned forest. It was seen in limited areas in burned Douglas Fir at The Cove. Seeds of a number of species of this genus have been found to respond to chemicals in smoke. This annual may not reoccur next spring.


Phacelia suaveolens (Sweet Scented Phacelia) – Like the previous species, this species is a fire obligate, dependant on smoke for a wildfire to initiate germination. It came up in large numbers in burned Knobcone Pine Forest and Mixed Manzanita Chaparral. It is unlikely to reoccur next spring.

Triteleia laxa (Ithuriel's Spear) – This is a common species of woodlands and grasslands. It was interesting to see this species come up under burned Douglas Fir on the lower slopes near the campground. This is a bulb-bearing species that was not observed in 2017 and must persist in a dormant state in the mature forest.

Further changes at The Cove are expected in coming years as a result of changing light conditions and as re-vegetation proceeds. Post-fire conditions provide invasive species a temporary opportunity to explode in numbers and contribute significantly to the seed bank. This could influence the long-term stability of the vegetation communities and should be monitored.
