About the Napa Open Space District

The Napa County Regional Park and Open Space District is committed to preserving open spaces and providing public access to protected lands in Napa County. Since our inception in 2006, the District has grown rapidly and now owns or manages more than 13,300 acres of property. These properties, which include operation of the three State Parks in Napa County, are home to more than 160 miles of recreational trails. There are several major projects planned in the coming years that will add additional acreage and trail miles to the District's holdings.

About the Position

The Deputy General Manager, in close collaboration with other senior staff, plans, organizes, directs, and coordinates the management of a growing network of protected lands, parks, camps, and recreational trails.
